Description: This satellite meeting will bring together key patient advocates from across the globe to discuss the need for governments and regulatory authorities to collaborate with patient advocacy organisations and industry to look for solutions for access to cancer care in low to middle income countries. A Call to Action will be presented by the Cancer Alliance of South Africa.

10:30 – 12:00 **Improving Cancer Outcomes in Africa: The Potential of Public-Private Partnerships; Organised by Glaxosmithkline (GSK)**

Description: GSK is committed to supporting programmes that have a sustainable positive impact on cancer prevention, detection and care in developing countries by collaborating with established organisations and national governments. This symposium will provide evidence demonstrating that public-private partnerships are effective, including a review of preliminary results from projects supporting vaccination, medical education and cancer registries. We hope that this evidence will compel other governments, academic institutions and private companies to increase their support of programmes that improve cancer outcomes in Africa.

10:30 - 12:00 ***The Future of NCDs in Africa: Prevention and Intervention Strategies in Tobacco Control; Organised by the American Cancer Society***

Description: Tobacco consumption has risen aggressively in Africa over the last 20 years, driven by robust economic growth and development and increased marketing efforts of the tobacco industry. This panel will explore the opportunity for prevention in Africa by considering the drivers of tobacco use, particularly the socio economic drivers. It will consider the urgency of taking action to prevent the epidemic in Africa by discussing policy options that target prevention and the economic drivers of tobacco use. It will also consider the experience in other countries and lessons learned.

12:00 – 13:25 ***Keynote lunch – Cancer and the Development Agenda; Organised by UICC***

Description: A formal lunch will be provided for Summit participants which will include keynote remarks by Her Excellency, Dr Christine Kaseba Sata on how best to incorporate cancer within the overall global health and development agenda.

13:30 - 15:00 ***The State of Oncology: Planning a Positive Future; Organised by Roche***

Description: This event will be an opportunity to share a short presentation of the State of Oncology report by its lead Author and Editors. An interactive panel discussion will follow to review the report findings and the policy changes that could be made by political leadership to ensure successful developments in oncology in the decades ahead, including women's cancers and future promises to patients.

Description: This event will feature key private sector leaders from various industries discussing how companies can embed UN commitments to reduce NCD risk factors into their own businesses and how to assist companies in LMICs do the same.

17.00 – 18.00 ***Launch of an International Partnership focused on Cancer Control Planning; Organised by the US National Cancer Institute***

Description: The International Cancer Control Planning Partnership (ICCPP) began meeting in August 2012 to organise efforts across multiple organizations in the area of national cancer control planning. Over the last 15 months, the group has developed a web portal of toolkits and existing plans, begun advocacy activities, and supported technical assistance for multiple cancer control planning efforts.

17.00 – 18.00 *Childhood Cancer: Rising to the Challenge in Today's Africa; Organised by the International Society for Paediatric Oncology and Sanofi Espoir Foundation*

Description: Approximately 200,000 children worldwide are diagnosed annually with cancer while an estimated 100,000 will die from the disease. These numbers are staggering given the fact that 70% of all childhood cancers are curable. The International Society of Paediatric Oncology (SIOP) is calling for coordinated action in the provision of appropriate treatment, care and support for children with cancer in Africa. National governments and their partners are urged to join forces to ensure that childhood cancer is made a public health priority.

17.00 – 18.00 *Closing the Cancer Divide: A New Frontier for Global Health Equity; Organised by the Global Task Force on Expanded Access to Cancer Care and Control (GTF.CCC)*

Description: This session builds on evidence garnered by the Global Task Force on Expanded Access to Cancer Care and Control and presented in its seminal publication Closing the Cancer Divide: An Equity Imperative (Harvard Global Equity Initiative). It will delve into the results and seek to promote collaboration around catalytic projects and innovative policies addressing childhood cancers, women's cancers, and global divide in pain and palliation in the context of diagonal health system strengthening and the global cancer network.

Drafted originally in 2006, the Declaration has been refreshed in order for this seminal advocacy document to adequately reflect the changing global health and development landscape. The refreshed World Cancer Declaration has been reviewed by global health leaders, advocates and partners. The final version will be formally launched to support global advocacy efforts calling for the inclusion of cancer prevention and control in the Post-2015 agenda.
